Fow, if any, special tools are needed to perform any mechanical task on the Model A. Take changing a tire for instance. The only tool actually needed is the jack, which was supplied in all new Fords. It can be easily substituted. A person has to position the jack securely under the frame and raise the car until the tire is off the ground. Then squeeze the beading of the tire towards the center of the rim. Slip the tire off the rim by starting at one side, progressing around the edge. Patch the tube and replace the tire. Then pump the tire up with a tire pump. It should be ready to use again. Try this on a late model car and you will find it is impossible.
