## MISTER TULIP'S HELPFUL HINT DEPARTMENT

Having trouble loosening that rusty bolt? Try this: beg, borrow or steal an instrument called an Impak-Driver. This palm-sized giant can remove the toughest of rusted bolts, or screws, and with a minimum of galling. First obtain the proper sized screw driver or socket (38 drive), install on end of Impak-Driver, insert in screw slot and strike with hammer. Also, don't forget to first flood with penetrating oil.
