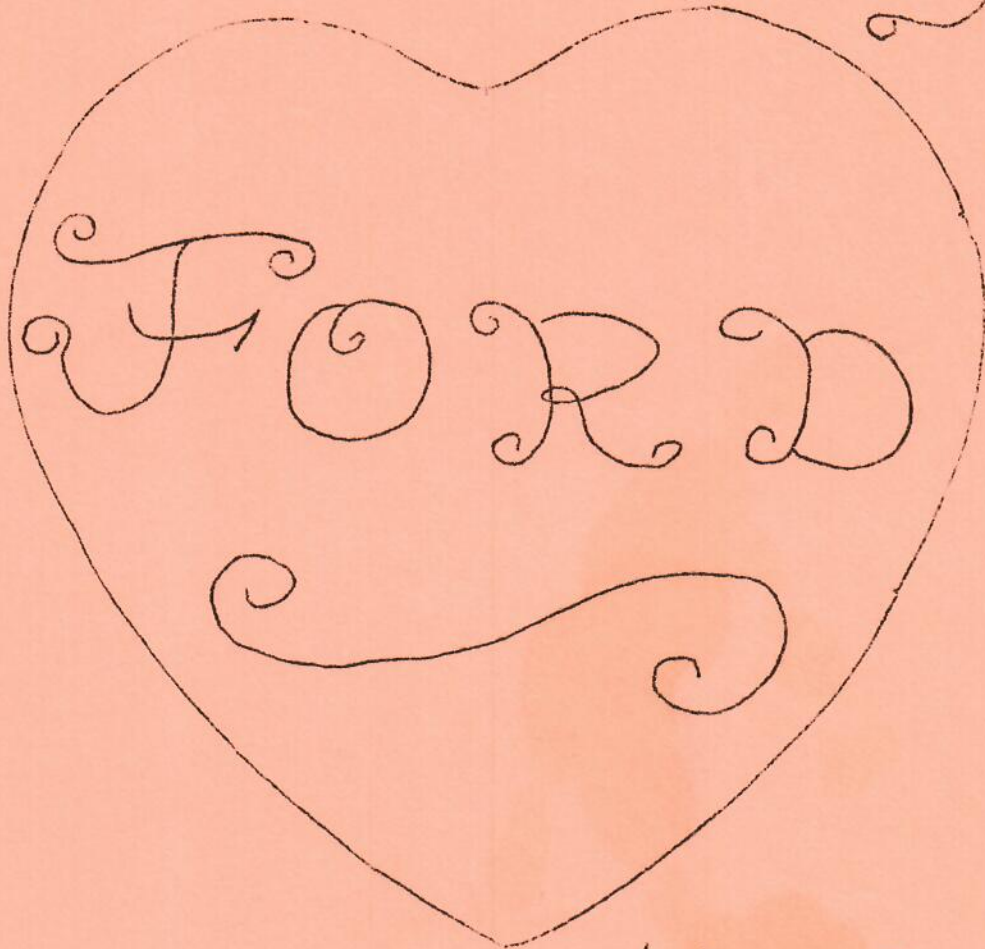

FEBRUARY BOARD MEETING

The monthly Board meeting met Thursday, January 26 at the home of Tom and Arlene Schenk. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by president Matt Plotkin.

The minutes of the December meeting were read by the Secretary and approved as submitted. The Treasurer's Report was given by Virgil Stockard and accepted.

Activities Chairman, Tom Schenk, reported on some of the major activities that have been set for the upcoming months..

Plans for other activities are in process and will be announced later.. Consideration is being given to changing the date of the Camp Out. Traditionally the Camp Out has been on Father's Day weekend, but it has been suggested that it be held the weekend prior to Father's Day. The question is to be brought up at the General Meeting for discussion and approval. The suggested location of the Camp Out is Lilac Oaks, which is where it was held last year.

Bev Marsh, who is Chairing the Christmas Party, reported on the party plans and recommended having the party this year at the Anaheim Bowl on December 16th. Details of the plans will be presented at the February General Meeting for discussion and approval.

President Matt Plotkin feels that this may be an appropriate time to review the By-Laws for any revisions

or up-dating that may seem in order. Jim Douglass has a copy of preliminary work that had been started but not completed. This marked-up copy will be studied to determine what may need updating, and then be submitted to the General membership..

President Plotkin also suggested that consideration be given to up-dating the Club's Tour Rules. Some rules may be either obsolete or do not meet present needs. President Plotkin recommended that a committee of past Activity Chairmen meet and suggest the revisions and updating they feel is needed.

In line with updating our rules, President Plotkin recommended that our procedures for providing new members with Club information revert to the Club's initial procedure which provided only welcoming information to prospective members and full Club information only when the actually became members..

To encourage greater familiarity with members' names and identify, it was suggested that there be a 25¢ fine for Club members not wearing a name tag at all events.

It was felt that there should be more publicity of Club events in various publications. Responsibility for this was given to the Secretary.

The next Board meeting will be at the home of Mary and Mike Livingston on February 23.. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

Amneus. Bill has a Model A and an Overland. At the seminar we will formulate at step by step procedure for taking apart and restoring the Model A. What do you do first so that you don't lose parts and make costly mistakes? We will have several experts who have done complete restorations to help us and answer questions. Bills address is 12102 Country Lane in Tustin. Nearest cross streets are Redhill & Skyline. Bills Phone if you get lost is 832-4754. Time is 7:30 p.m. Friday, February 10th.

If you can't join us at the seminar the tip for the month is before going on tour adjust your points at .016 and lubricate the distributor cam with a small dab of Vasaline.. Thhs will prevent wear on the fibre block that opens & closes the points. Thusly your points will maintain their correct setting for many miles and eliminate that embarrassing back firing and loss of power that occurs when the point setting gets too close.
