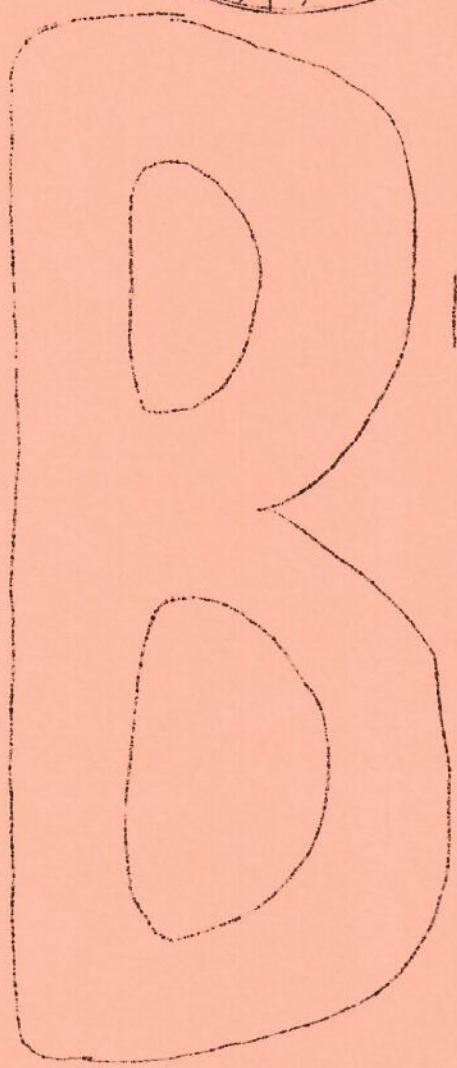




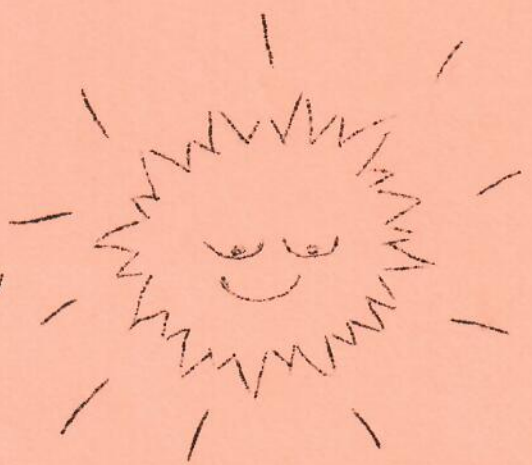

TECH TATTER

TECH TIP: If you drive your car any distance from home on tours or trips, the following are the most basic spare parts which I consider most important to carry under the seat. Screw driver, pliers, small crescent wrench, $\frac{1}{2}$ & 9/6 end wrench, condenser (several), coil, generator, water pump and if using a popout switch a suitable alternate ignition system usually consisting of the cable end that screws into the distributor with just a wire long enough to reach the coil. These minimum parts & tools will cure about 90% of on the road breakdowns short of a major failure such as a timing gear or a rod.

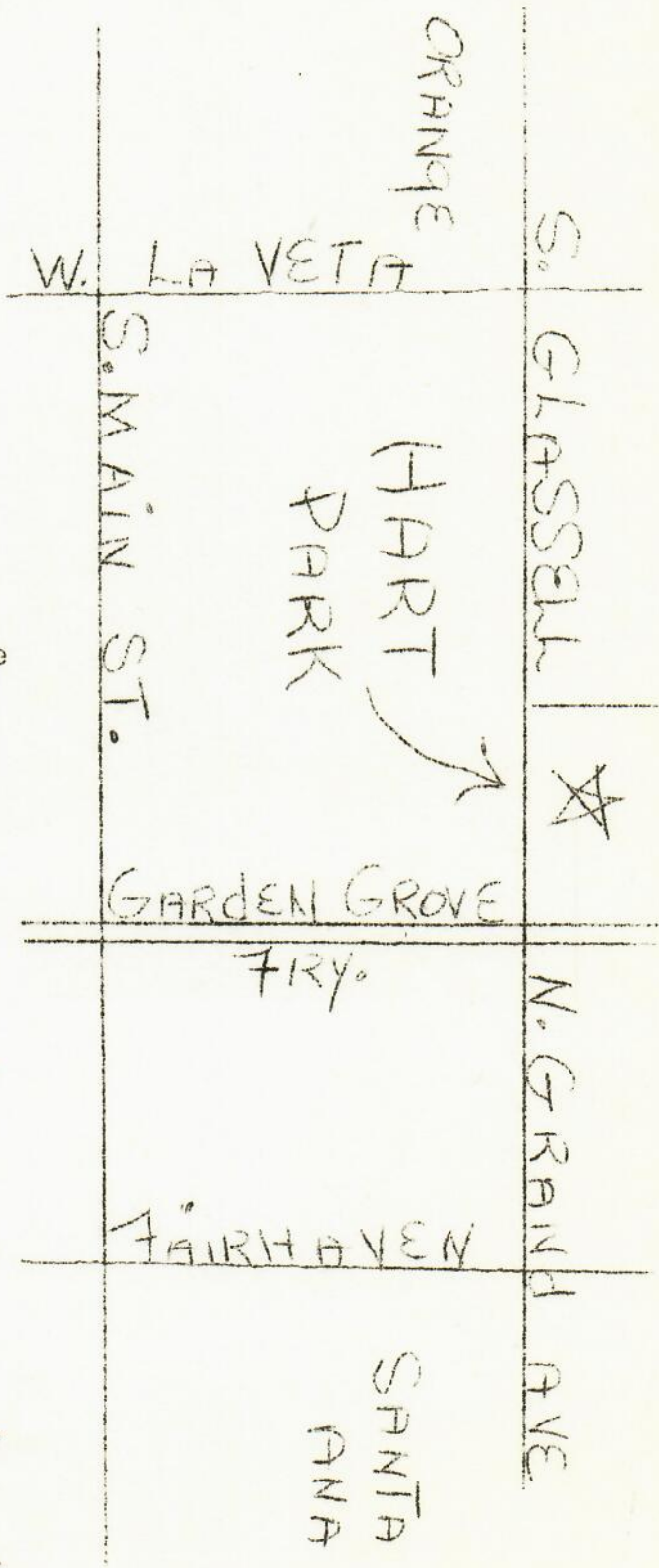
