Highlights of the May Tech Seminar

"What Went Wrong?" Tech Seminar

Saturday, the 16th, was a magnificently beautiful Southern California morning for a seminar. Held over at Jeff and Jennifer Ferrario's home, to help tear apart their engine that self destructed while driving home from the club's last Pancake Breakfast. Actually, Jennifer was the one doing all the tearing apart, while all of us "experts" stood around watching, drinking coffee and eating donuts. She's a real, "get your hands dirty" type of a person!!

Jennifer wanted to learn everything she could about the internals of her engine and what actually went wrong with it. She told us that while driving home, the engine spewed out a ton of smoke and then simply quit. Hummmm....THAT doesn't sound good! She and her husband already had the engine out of the car and on an engine stand by the time we all got there. With a number of club members guiding her, Jennifer began by removing the head. With a bit of persuasion from a head puller, the head didn't put up too much of a fight coming off, thank goodness. Looking in each of the cylinders, there didn't seem to be anything obviously out of order. However, while rolling the crank-shaft over just a bit, we noticed that the valves were not moving. Humm.... So, off came the front cover. That revealed the stripped fabric cam gear. We also found that the center metal hub that mounts the gear to the cam, was torn loose from the fabric material. OK..now we're getting somewhere!!

Next, Jennifer removed the oil pan. As soon as that came off, we found some chunks of aluminum. Oh boy... <u>THAT'S</u> not good at all! So out came all the pistons. That revealed that two of the pistons had not only broken rings, but also several broken ring lands. Another aspect of the removed pistons, which shocked this editor, was the fact that the pistons had 4 ring grooves, rather than the more standard 3 that I'm used to. Wow!! I had heard of these, but never actually seen any!

So, now the question that needs to be answered is; does Jennifer and Jeff wish to proceed with rebuilding this engine, or purchase a brand new one? Decisions, decisions.


While the news of all the things wrong with their engine wasn't good, at least Jennifer got a VERY good education on the internal workings of her Model A engine. She is a real trooper! She and her husband are now considering the possibility of purchasing a Burtz engine....maybe. Not a bad way to go, in my humble opinion. And, oh, by the way, I forgot to mention that the babbitt thrust washer had a very large crack in it. Not sure how to fix that one just yet. We'll need to see what options might be available for that....

OCMAFC Military veterans

Ron Andrews – US Army 1970-1976

As July 20, 1970 rolled around, I had just returned home to Fullerton, California, from a great water-skiing trip to Lake Elsinore. Waiting at home for me was "The envelope" with my personal greetings from the US Armed Forces. The bus trip from Southern California to Fort Ord in Northern California was long but I kept in my mind that I would survive.

Early in zero week we were given an opportunity to acquire a job of our choice for the cost of one year. I must admit basic training went fast and I was on my way to Fort Lee, Virginia—another part of the country, new friends, and job skills. We learned to gauge storage tanks, run pipelines, fill collapsible tanks and we even had some free time to visit the Washington Monument, the Smithsonian and Arlington.

Graduation and assignments with no leave came, and our whole class figured we were going to southeast Asia. But some of us were going to Germany, some to Korea, a few to Alaska. Several days later and after a long flight, I arrived at my assignment in a new country of bratwurst and beer. I was assigned to a Cavalry Unit with tanks, armored carriers and trucks, and was designated the Section Chief. We spent a lot of time in the field but several times a year we went to the East German border to relieve the units there.

In 1972, I was able to acquire a month leave. A friend in my unit contacted me and said if I could get an acceptance from either Army Reserve or National Guard, I could finish my enlistment at home in one of these units. I returned to Germany with paperwork in hand and was released about a week later. During my long flight home, I had time to ponder what I had experienced and had seen - it would stick with me the rest of my life.

The National Guard would be a breeze. I attended college and the National Guard at the same time. National Guard was one weekend a month and two weeks in the summer (and a few trips to universal studios for training - it was the best fun).

I look back to this part of my life and feel that I was very fortunate to have had this experience.

Route 66 - Finally! By Diane Gaughne

Missouri chief engineer Piepmeier wrote to Cyrus Avery, "I am willing to accept 62, 66 or 60, from Chicago to Los Angeles, and nothing else...That is my position, and I hope you will agree with me and that we can get something settled at once." Avery accepted this and presented this to MacDonald, chief of the Bureau of Public Roads.


The good news was that Kentucky had just agreed that Route 60 would go from Springfield, Missouri across Kentucky and Virginia to Newport News. This left Route 66 as the number from Chicago to Los Angeles. At last! The date was July 23, 1925. Although 66 had not been the first choice, it was acceptable.

W. C. Markham executive secretary of the American Association of State Highway Officials, urged Avery to accept this action by Kentucky so they could get on with marking roads and making maps. On August 11, Markham sent a memorandum to the state highway departments of 11 states, notifying them of the numbering decision.

When all was said and done, Cyrus Avery was pleased with his 24 months of hard work. The number was accepted by the secretary of agriculture, and in November, 1926, it became the law of the land.

So where did the number 66 come from? No one knows...


